


Artist's Journal and Artwork Explores Chronic Illness

in New Exhibition

Daily Nodes Now on Display at Nevada Humanities Program Gallery in Las Vegas

The Daily Nodes exhibition is now on display at the Nevada Humanities Program Gallery, featuring works by Candace Garlock that were inspired by her healing process from a recent diagnosis of multiple sclerosis.

February 1, 2024—LAS VEGAS, NV– <u>*Daily Nodes*</u>, a motivating new exhibition of artworks that showcases the work of Nevada artist Candace Garlock, is on display February 1 - March 27, 2024, at the Nevada Humanities Program Gallery in Las Vegas. Garlock explores the

metaphor of nodes as points of connection in her daily art journaling. In this exhibition, she records her healing process from multiple sclerosis, which has left her with ongoing, debilitating symptoms. The daily illustrations and writing included in this exhibition are a part of Garlock's physical and mental healing processes.

"Chronic illness is one of the most challenging things that anyone can face in their lives. Candace Garlock has been able to channel her experiences into a creative force that is a way to find solace and also an inspiration to others. Her work illuminates how the humanities - the consideration and expression of our lived experiences - can help chart a path out of the darkest and most difficult things we encounter," says Christina Barr, executive director of Nevada Humanities. "We hope that this exhibition will help raise awareness of chronic illness and inspire those who are suffering to see a path towards self expression that may ease some of their burden."

"I have always regarded Nevada Humanities as a resource for connection in matters that are important yet sometimes forgotten about," said Candace Garlock, artist and curator of *Daily Nodes*. "After the pandemic, it has been evident that there are many more people suffering from chronic illnesses. Many people don't understand, or have the language, to discuss what is happening to them. Many people don't feel like they can talk about their conditions out of fear of judgment and discrimination. I feel that my story is needed and that Nevada Humanities is the one organization that can help reach others with similar stories."
