LAS VEGAS, NEVADA, August 31, 2021—As part of the ongoing Nevada Humanities

Exhibition Series and in celebration of the 20th anniversary of the Las Vegas Book Festival, a new exhibition, Nevada P.S. I Love You Postcard Project: Love Notes from Across the Silver State, opens online on September 30, 2021, at nevadahumanities.org and will be on display as a virtual exhibition indefinitely. The exhibition will also be open to the public for viewing by appointment only at the Nevada Humanities Program Gallery in Las Vegas before it travels to Great Basin College in Elko and Truckee Meadows Community College in Reno in 2022. An exhibition discussion featuring select artists and poets will be led by Bobbie Ann Howell, Nevada Humanities Program Manager, and will take place as a live Zoom event on Thursday, November 4, 2021, at 6 pm PDT. This event requires advance registration; register for this Zoom event at nevadahumanities.org.

Nevada P.S. I Love You Postcard Project: Love Notes from Across the Silver State is part of an ongoing project to connect Nevadans, in urban and rural communities across the state, sharing the things that postcard creators love about Nevada. Selected postcards will be included in the exhibition and the artist may also choose to have their card become part of a group mailed to another Nevada community. There is a final call to submit Nevada inspired art, poetry, or haiku for this upcoming exhibition. Nevadans ages five to adult are invited to submit a handmade Nevada P.S. I Love You Postcard to the Nevada Humanities Exhibition Series.

The postcard submission deadline is September 20, 2021; submission information and guidelines may be found at nevadahumanities.org/special-initiatives.

"The *P.S. I Love You Postcard Project* has inspired hundreds of Nevadans to create and send postcards to their neighbors across the state, often to people they have not yet met," said Christina Barr, Nevada Humanities Executive Director. "These postcards have inspired creativity and connection in unanticipated ways, and they are beautiful reminders of how Nevada's open spaces and stories can bridge geographic and political divides and connect people who live very different lives."

Nevada P.S. I Love You Postcard Project will be on display at the Nevada Humanities
Program Gallery until November 24, 2021, and may be viewed by appointment Tuesdays through Thursdays from 1 to 4 pm. Masks are required and numbers are limited to accommodate social distancing as we respond to the continuing changes in the pandemic protocols. 
