

Call for SPARK! Youth Poetry Competition for Clark County Students in Grades 9 - 12

SPARK! Youth Poetry Competition Registration Deadline October 1, 2023

The Spark! Youth Poetry Competition takes place at the Las Vegas Book Festival in October, and Clark County high school students are invited to present three original poems for competitive judging.

August 8, 2023—LAS VEGAS, NV–As part of the 2023 <u>Las Vegas Book Festival</u>, Nevada Humanities and the Nevada Arts Council invite high school students in grades 9-12, residing in Clark County, Nevada, to write and present original poems as part of the annual <u>SPARK! Youth Poetry Competition</u>. The competition will be held on Saturday, October 21, 2023, in the Poetry Pavilion at the *Las Vegas Book Festival*. Students will be asked to present three original poems that will be judged by a panel made up of poets, authors, educators, and other community members. The top three highest scoring students will determine, first, second, and third place. Cash awards for winning poems will include: first place: \$30; second place: \$200; and third place: \$100.

The deadline for registering to participate in this competition is **Sunday**, **October 1**, **2023**. Youth Poetry Competition will take place at the *Las Vegas Book Festival*, Poetry Pavilion, from 1:30 to 3:30 pm PDT, with the awards ceremony immediately following the competition.
