September 7, 2022—RENO, Nev.—On Saturday, September 10, 2022, Nevada Humanities will host the **Nevada Humanities Literary Crawl**—the premier literary event in northern Nevada—at venues throughout the California Avenue corridor in Reno beginning at 11 am with the keynote address at the Nevada Museum of Art and concluding at 8 pm. This year's event also features **The Prologue Launch Party**, an evening of prose and poetry on September 9 at 6 pm, in partnership with The Holland Project, 140 Vesta Street in Reno.

What:

Nevada Humanities Literary Crawl explores different genres of literature through panel discussions, readings, interactive workshops, book signings, poetry readings, kids' activities, art installations, live performances, and food. Access to all events and venues is free and open to the public, and all ages are welcome.
